Public Hearing: THE BEDC BOARD WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING ON A PROJECT TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR BUSINESSES IMPACTED BY THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC; AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS: D. Vaughn:
