DISCUSS AND REVIEW:

Approval of the February 24, 2022, Burnet Police Department Citizens advisory Board regular meeting minutes: Board Member Mike O'Hagen moved to approve the February 24, 2022 Regular Meeting minutes as presented. Board Member Glenn Labhart seconded; the motion carried unanimously.

Presentation of Police Department patrol operations provided by Captain Jason Davis: Captain Davis shared a comprehensive presentation on the Burnet Police Department Patrol Division to include, organizational staffing, staffing issues, duties of a patrol officer, patrol stats, and patrol training. Captain Davis provided all present with a live demonstration of a taser gun and discussed instances that patrol officers face that could require the use of a taser. Captain Davis also covered defense tactics, use of drones for police departments and the direction the patrol division is moving in.

Police Department Pursuit Policy:

Current Policy: Chief Lee reviewed the current Pursuit Policy of the Burnet Police Department with all present. Chief Lee explained the pros and cons of the present policy and did an overview with videos of possible scenarios. The group discussed area agency assistance and protocols.

Proposed Policy Changes: Chief Lee presented the Departments proposed policy changes for review. The group agreed the policy changes would benefit the safety of the officers as well as
